When you are outside mowing lawns, pulling weeds and raking everything up, please DO NOT forget the alley way behind your home. It is so important to NOT let grass and weeds grow tall and dry out in alley ways as they present a tremendous fire danger! Keep these areas trimmed and free of grass and weeds for everyone's safety.

Code Enforcement would like to remind everyone about the presence of inoperable and/or unlicensed vehicles on your property. According to the definition of solid waste in the city ordinances, vehicles that are inoperable and/or unlicensed constitute a code violation for your property. If you have such a vehicle and don't have the title in hand, please call Gina @ (541)278-6300 for assistance. If the inoperable and/or unlicensed vehicle is valued at \$500 or less and should be dismantled, we can provide you with a Junk Slip Form 272 that will help you get rid of it! Don't forget our "COMMUNITY CARES" sign-up! There are folks in our city that need help with cleaning up their yards and good communities take care of each other! If you have a few spare hours and some equipment, please sign up to help your neighbors! Call City Hall or Code Enforcement to sign up, there is need right now for your assistance.

I think social media can be a good place to communicate and network in ways that can help keep our community safer, but it is only one tool. Please do report things to the sheriff's office so they can be even more informed and will have a record to use when they need it for documentation. Talk to your neighbors, but please make sure your conversations are not just hearsay or gossip as these can be more destructive than helpful. Also be aware that often times our law enforcement and code enforcement officers are doing much more behind the scenes than you are aware of to correct situations. You are always welcome to contact them and ask questions if you feel you need to.

THE MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE ATHENA CITY COUNCIL

April 14, 2022

Attendance: Mayor Schroeder called the regular meeting of the Athena City Council to order at 6:00 pm. Roll was taken with Councilors Katie Zmuda, Sally Thompson, Wayne Kostur, Jesse Bonifer and Gene Wright present. City Recorder, Michelle Fox, and 3 guests were also present. Mayor Schroeder led everyone in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Business from the Public:

Athena Mainstreet Association (AMA): April Makenna reported for the Mainstreet Association. April reported the AMA had new board members and Katie Zmuda was elected as the new President. April reminded everyone the date for the Athena Clean Sweep which will be held April 30 from 9:00-12:00, which also coincides with Humbert's Free Dump Day. Volunteers are always welcome. April asked the Council if they would donate \$200.00 again this year for the clean sweep. A motion was made and seconded to donate \$200.00 to AMA for the Clean Sweep.

Brad Baird from Anderson Perry addressed the Council concerning a new Waste Water Facilities Plan. This was last done is 2006. Due to the age of our wastewater plant, it is necessary to begin looking at a new plan. Improvements are going to need to be done in the near future and the DEQ requires this study before proceeding on any improvements. The cost for this study is approximately \$50,000. Brad submitted a joint agreement between Anderson Perry and the City for the council's review.

<u>Consent Agenda:</u> A motion was made and seconded to approve the council meeting minutes of the 3/10/22 meeting, the financial statements, and bills. Motion carried 5-0.

Actionable Items: A motion was made and seconded to approve new visa cards from the Bank of Eastern Oregon for Stephanie Partida and Karrah King with a spending limit of \$3,000 each. Kristin Williams card will be cancelled. Motion carried 5-0.

A motion was made and seconded to accept the contract with the YMCA for swimming pool services for the 2022 season. Motion carried 5-0.

Committee Reports

Planning Commission: Mayor Schroeder appointed Ken Davenport and Eugene Ezell to the Planning Commission.

New Business: Cliff Taylor, teacher at Weston-McEwen High School, is looking for city volunteers to listen to student presentations. Gene Wright, Katie Vorhauer, and April McKenna volunteered. Michelle will contact Cliff Taylor and get date and time for volunteers.

<u>Old Business:</u> Humbert Property - Michelle updated the council on the Humbert Property. The abatement process will start as soon as legal counsel has reviewed all documents.

Michelle reminded council to make sure their SEI Reports were submitted by April 15.

The city received 10 applications for the Public Works position. The interview committee will review applications the week 18-22. Interviews will be held the week of April 25-29.

Business from the Departments & Councilors:

Library: Stephanie has hit the ground running. Library has been busy. Report was submitted.

Parks & Rec: Playground equipment has been installed. Mulch will be ordered for underneath.

Public Works: They are waiting for permits to continue work on the snack shed.

Fire: None

Sheriff: Report in packet. Council Kostur will ask about the transients who have been seen in town.

Administration: The reader board is functioning. Policy needs to be written on what content can and cannot be put on sign.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned at 7:00 pm. The next regular council meeting will be May 12, 2022 @ 6:00 pm.
