



Athena Caledonian Games has a line-up of family fun in our City Park, athletic competition on the school field, and entertainment right after the parade in City Park. At 10:30 AM, the Celtic Band, ENDALOS will be performing. They are from the Oregon coast and surely an up-and-coming band to hear and watch their successful rise to fame. They will also perform at 12:30 PM in City Park.

There will be a Highland Dancing demonstration at center stage in the park at 1:30 PM. All interested in Highland dancing are invited to attend and dance with Tami Crum of Pendleton, if you wish!

There will be the Caledonian Parade on Main Street at 9:00 AM and then a Pet Parade and a Bike and Trike Parade in City Park. So have the kids decorate their bikes and enter in the parade at the park. Pets last year were even dressed in kilts but it is not mandatory to enter! It was great fun.

The athletics competition starts at noon.

Athletic competitions under the leadership of Alan Wernsing of Athena and the Scottish American Athletic Association are featured all day under the Big Green Tent on the high school athletic field. Preregistration and fee payment is suggested for the Scottish athletic events named, in part: Stone Put (throwing a Scottish hammer for distance), Sheaf Toss (throwing a 16 lb. bag of straw), and Caber Toss (the contest that looks like throwing a telephone pole!) Age limitations and classifications apply. SAAA ensures that equipment meets weight specifications and measurement standards. Professional athletes and first-time throwers here at Athena compete side by side and have a wonderful time.

There will be family fun time with games at about 1:45 ending with a watermelon eating contest at roughly 2:15 PM. At about 2:30 we will have the second of our Bonniest Knees Contests. (In Scotland, the bonnie lad and lassies are beautiful. Well, we're looking for the most beautiful....the bonniest knees.) Katie Zmuda is judging and of course, she is blind-folded. Judging technique? Ummmm,she touches the knees to learn the most beautiful. The holder of the coveted trophy was Delbert Durfee in 2021. I wonder if he will be able to hang on to the title this year.

At 4 PM, our closing ceremony will be the Candle Lighting Ceremony around the cairn in City Park. It is a short, stand-up service----in remembrance of our friends who are not here now and a blessing with raised candles to family and clan.

With the help of a grant from the Umatilla County Cultural Coalition, Caledonian programs are free with a full schedule.

THE MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE ATHENA CITY COUNCIL

June 9, 2022

Attendance: City Recorder, Michelle Fox called the regular meeting of the Athena City Council to order at 6:05 pm. Roll was taken with Councilors Katie Zmuda, Wayne Kostur, Sally Thompson, and Jesse Bonifer present. Mayor Schroeder and Councilor Wright were excused. Two guests were also present. City Recorder Fox led everyone in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Sally Thompson nominated Councilor Wayne Kostur to run the meeting. Katie Zmuda seconded. Vote was unanimous in favor of Councilor Wayne Kostur running the meeting in the absence of the Mayor and Council President.

Business from the Public:

Athena Mainstreet Association (AMA): April Makenna reported for the Mainstreet Association. The first Tuesday Market was small but went well. April looks forward to a great Tuesday Market season. Youth Citizen of the Year was Peyton McLouth. Congratulations to Peyton. Permission was granted by council to close Main Street on July 29 at 3:00 for Community Night Out. April also asked about looking into disposal bags for the park due to dogs running loose.

Sue Friese submitted a letter from the Caledonian Games Committee.

A request was made to contact the Umatilla County Fire Department to clean up the weeds on the Athena Fire Department lot. Michelle will contact Fire Chief, Dave Baty.

Consent Agenda: A motion was made and seconded to approve the council meeting minutes of the 5/12/22 meeting, the financial statements, and bills. Motion carried 4-0.

<u>Actionable Items:</u> A motion was made and seconded to approve Resolution #2022-05 Declaring the City's Election to Receive State Revenues. Motion carried 4-0.

A motion was made and seconded to approve Resolution #2022-06 Adopting the Budget, Making Appropriations, Impose & Categorize the Tax. Motion carried 4-0.

Committee Reports

Planning Commission: Reviewing and updating the Comprehensive Plan was tabled until the next meeting due to absent commissioners.

New Business: A draft policy was reviewed and briefly discussed for the reader board. The council members will review and bring their revisions back to the July meeting.

A motion was made and seconded to approve giving City Recorder, Michelle Fox, the authority to accept and sign documentation on behalf of the City of Athena for the ODOT Temporary Easement. Motion carried 4-0.

Old Business: Michelle updated the Council on the Humbert Property. She will proceed with process.

Business from the Departments & Councilors:

Library: The library is in the process of hiring a new summer intern.

Parks & Rec: The playground equipment is complete. The pool will open June 13.

Public Works: They are still waiting on permits to finish the snack shack and restrooms at ball field.

Fire: None
Sheriff: None

Administration: The city of Athena will receive \$400,000 from the County to help with funding for the installation of water and sewer to the new housing development. Auditor will be here July 20.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned at 6:54 pm. The next regular council meeting will be **July** 14, 2022 @ 6:00 pm
