THE MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE ATHENA CITY COUNCIL

November 10, 2022

Attendance: Mayor Schroeder called the regular meeting of the Athena City Council to order at 6:00 pm. Roll was taken with Councilors Katie Zmuda, Sally Thompson, Wayne Kostur and Gene Wright present. Councilor Jesse Bonifer was absent from meeting. Assistant City Recorder, Karrah King and 6 guests were also present. Mayor Schroeder led everyone in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Business from the Public:

Booster Club: Katy King reported on behalf of the Booster Club and asked council to consider letting them paint/add decal to the water tower. Mayor Schroeder asked Katy to get some prices and ideas and come back to present those to council.

Athena Mainstreet Association (AMA): April Mckenna reported for the Mainstreet Association. Trunk or Treat went really well she had asked if the city would look into purchasing a few more detour signs. Adopt-a-Highway Clean-Up was November 6th they worked about an hour and a half and got 8 bags of trash. The Christmas Bazaar will be held on December 3rd from 10:00-3:00 in the Stahl Building. The winter light parade will be December 4th at 4:00pm. AMA will be hosting their Christmas Wreath Making Night at the Stahl Building on December 6, 2022 at 6:00pm. The \$40.00 registration fee must be pre-paid, and limited spots are available. Christmas lighting contest will be December 19th. Contact athenamainstreet@gmail.com for any questions.

<u>Consent Agenda:</u> A motion was made and seconded to approve the council meeting minutes of the 10/20/22 meeting, the financial statements, and bills. Motion carried 4-0.

Abigail and Stephen Craigen are replacing the existing utility room (approximately 81 sq.ft.). The new addition will be 10'x26'. A total of 260 sq.ft

<u>New Business:</u> A work session was scheduled with Anderson-Perry for Tuesday, December 13, 2022 at 6:00pm to discuss the new Waste Water Facilities Plan.

Mayor Schroeder asked Athena Mainstreet Association to come up with a schedule for Public Works to swap out the banners on Main Street light poles.

<u>Old Business:</u> Council was asked to provide a list of questions for Charter/Spectrum to be addressed via zoom with representatives from the company on Decembers council meeting.

Tim Sprenger with Aspen Construction shared an update with the Aspen Heights Development. He is hoping to break ground in December and is awaiting approval of a few things from the City's Engineer, Brad Baird.

Business from the Departments & Councilors:

Library: Stephanie included the Annual Library Service Review 2021-2022 and her Council Report. Stephanie has met her goals as the Library Director.

Parks & Rec: None

Public Works: Contacted Fire Chief Dave Baty- he will plan a date for the fire department to burn the debris pile.

Fire: None

Sheriff: Wayne will make a new cost report to show the cost of creating an Athena Police Department.

Deputy Wolverton was present on behalf of Umatilla County Sheriff's Office. He included several data breakdowns of hours contracted with the county and hours provided by the county. He also provided a summary of the stats gathered by the speed reader board that has been present on Main St and 3rd St between October 5-October 22. The average volume of cars per day: 1,205. Average Vehicular Speed 17.0 mph.

Administration: A reminder that City Hall, Athena Public Library, and the Public Works will be closed for Veterans Day and the Thanksgiving Holiday.

The library will be closed Monday, December 26th.


We are also hosting our annual giving tree at the library. We have lots of tags available. Pick one up to make a local kids Christmas a little bit brighter this holiday season.


