THE MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE ATHENA CITY COUNCIL

December 8, 2022

<u>Attendance:</u> Mayor Schroeder called the regular meeting of the Athena City Council to order at 6:00 pm. Roll was taken with Councilors Katie Zmuda, Wayne Kostur and Gene Wright present. Councilors Thompson and Bonifer were excused. City Recorder, Michelle Fox, and 1 guest were also present. Mayor Schroeder led everyone in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Business from the Public:

Athena Mainstreet Association (AMA): Brenda Vorhauer reported for the Mainstreet Association. The Holiday Bazaar was a success again this year. The light parade was cancelled due to lack of entries. The house lighting contest will be judged on December 19, 2022. The Watts Fund will be funding all the prizes for the contest. The AMA received a grant from the Wildhorse Foundation. This will be used to buy chairs for the Stahl Building.

<u>Consent Agenda:</u> A motion was made and seconded to approve the council meeting minutes of the 11/10/22 meeting, the financial statements, and bills. Motion carried 3-0.

Actionable Items: A motion was made and seconded to approve the General Election Results. Motion carried 3-0.

A motion was made and seconded to approve a business license from Jet's What Could Bee Salon. Motion carried 3-0.
